The International Strategic Studies Association's Zahedi Center for the Study of Monarchy, Traditional Governance, and Sovereignty invites applications to participate in this important project. Each participant would make a contribution to the research and chapter writings for a major study on the topic, which would then be published by the Center to stimulate broader public discussion worldwide.

There is no participation cost once accepted into the Project.

The change from the planned November 29, 2022, London conference to a broader project, in which participants would contribute electronically from around the world, was necessitated by the fact that many qualified participants could not travel to London for the event, particularly after they had already done so in September 2022 for the Funeral of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
